Sharing God's Abundant Love

Pastor's

Perspective

"It is Written"

Matthew 4:1-11

When Jesus is tempted by the devil in the wilderness his defense is the Word of God. The devil tempts Jesus with three powerful temptations and in response to each temptation Jesus proclaims, "It is written..." He would then quote scripture and blow up each of the temptations.



How would we fare if we were sorely tempted? What we read about in the temptation account is "Applied Theology." Jesus applied his understanding of God's Word to his present situation. Note that he didn't say to Satan, "Hold on while I look that up" or "Is the answer to that in Deuteronomy or Leviticus?" He knew the heart of the Word of God and how it was to be applied in his life.

I know many people who have memorized scores of Bible passages. That is never a bad thing. However, it has been my observation that it is a smaller subset of that group that has actually internalized these passages and has been able to apply them in their day to day lives. I believe knowing the Word of God is an important first step that should be followed by searching the meaning out of these passages and finally applying them.

The Word of God is indeed a powerful instrument in the face of temptation. However, we must stay alert for even the devil can quote scripture. We should not be lured into using snippets of scripture to justify whatever we wish to do. Unfortunately, throughout history that has been a tactic used to rally others to a stance or a cause. That is not honoring the heart of Holy Scripture. It is on us to be familiar with the overall intent of scripture. We then should allow that understanding be the light that leads us forth each day.

#2 - How are we saved?

Presbyterian We are saved by grace alone. Good works result, but are not the basis of salvation..

Methodist We are saved by grace alone. Good works must result, but do not obtain salvation.

Lutheran

We are saved by grace when God grants righteousness through faith alone. Good works inevitably result, but they are not the basis of salvation.

Catholic

God infuses the gift of faith in the baptized, which is maintained by good works and receiving Penance and the Eucharist.

Orthodox

God became human so humans could be deified, that is, have the energy of God's life in them.

Anglican

We share in Christ's victory, who died for our sins, freeing us through baptism to become living members of the church.

As we look for trees to start budding and flowers to emerge from the ground to give us signs of hope that our winter weather is finally over, we also start April with a story of hope. At our Traditional service on April 6 we hear



the story of Lazarus being raised to new life, unbound and set free. What a perfect day for the Confirmation ceremony, in which the three Confirmands will publicly profess their faith and lifelong pledge of faithfulness! We also will be having a brief congregational meeting after the service. So please plan to be there on April 6 to show your support to the Confirmands and participate in the meeting.

We begin Holy Week with our Blended service on April 13, which is Palm Sunday. The Procession of Palms commemorates Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem - "Ride on, ride on in majesty!" At the 7:00 PM service on Maundy Thursday the reading from the Gospel John tells of Jesus washing his disciples' feet and his commandment to love one another. On Good Friday at our 7:00 PM service the story of Jesus' passion from his arrest to burial is read from the Gospel of John – "Were you there when they crucified my Lord?"

Then on April 20 we "Celebrate Jesus, Celebrate – He is Risen!" Please join us for either (or both!) the 7 am Easter Sunrise service which is held outside (weather permitting), or the 9:30 am service. It will be a wonderful day for us all to gather together as a family in Christ to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord.

The sermon song at our Blended service on April 27 "Christ is Alive! Let Christians Sing" is a perfect song to remind us that we should share the Good News. We learn of Jesus' first meeting with the disciples after he had risen – "..blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed." And April 27 marks the last worship service led by Pastor Bodine prior to his retirement. Please plan to join us as we wish "Joy in the Journey" to Pastor and Pat.

You may have noticed that since January there have been song leaders each Sunday to help lead congregational singing. We have gotten positive feedback and plan to continue that practice. Anyone is welcome to be a song leader – you don't have to be a choir member and don't have to commit to doing it weekly. Please let Melanie Lohr know if you'd like to be one. And thank you to those who already have been lending their voices to lead the songs.

SPINACH QUICHE

1 frozen single pastry crust
1/2 cup chopped onion
6 slices bacon, chopped
8 beaten eggs
1/2 cup sour cream
1/2 cup milk, or light cream
1/4 teaspoon salt
1/8 teaspoon pepper
a dash of nutmeg (optional)
3 cups chopped spinach
2/3 cup shredded mozzarella
1/2 cup shredded Swiss cheese (2 oz)

In a large skillet,cook bacon until crisp. drain on paper towel.

Cook onions until tender.

In a bowl stir together, eggs, sour cream, milk, salt, pepper, and if desired, nutmeg.

Stir in onion,bacon,spinach and cheeses. Line a 9 inch pie plate with pastry shell.

Pour egg mixture into pie shell.

Bake at 325 degrees for 45 to 50 minutes or until a knife

inserted in the center comes out clean.

If necessary, cover the edge of crust with foil to prevent over-browning. Let stand for 10 minutes before serving.
